<p>State</p> <p>Proposal 22-1 A proposal to amend the state constitution to require annual public financial disclosure reports by legislators and other state officers and change state legislator term limit to 12 total years in legislature</p> <p>This proposed constitutional amendment would:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Require members of legislature, governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, and attorney general file annual public financial disclosure reports after 2023, including assets, liabilities, income sources, future employment agreements, gifts, travel reimbursements, and positions held in organizations except religious, social, and political organizations. Require legislature implement but not limit or restrict reporting requirements. Replace current term limits for state representatives and state senators with a 12-year total limit in any combination between house and senate, except a person elected to senate in 2022 may be elected the number of times allowed when that person became a candidate. <p>Should this proposal be adopted?</p> <p>Yes <input type="radio"/></p> <p>No <input type="radio"/></p>	<p>Proposal 22-3 A proposal to amend the state constitution to establish new individual right to reproductive freedom, including right to make all decisions about pregnancy and abortion; allow state to regulate abortion in some cases; and forbid prosecution of individuals exercising established right</p> <p>This proposed constitutional amendment would:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Establish new individual right to reproductive freedom, including right to make and carry out all decisions about pregnancy, such as prenatal care, childbirth, postpartum care, contraception, sterilization, abortion, miscarriage management, and infertility; Allow state to regulate abortion after fetal viability, but not prohibit if medically needed to protect a patient's life or physical or mental health; Forbid state discrimination in enforcement of this right; prohibit prosecution of an individual, or a person helping a pregnant individual, for exercising rights established by this amendment; Invalidate state laws conflicting with this amendment. <p>Should this proposal be adopted?</p> <p>Yes <input type="radio"/></p> <p>No <input type="radio"/></p>	<p>Parks and Trails Millage Proposition</p> <p>Shall the tax limitation imposed under the Michigan Constitution on real and personal property in Saugatuck Township be increased by up to .5 mill (\$.50 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for 10 years, 2023 through 2032, inclusive, for the operation and maintenance of parks; the creation and maintenance of public trails; and the acquisition, preservation, improvement, and conservation of park property and park property rights and natural areas; and shall the Township be authorized to levy the millage during each of these years? The millage would raise an estimated \$195,352.00 in the first year the millage is levied.</p> <p>Yes <input type="radio"/></p> <p>No <input type="radio"/></p>	<p>Saugatuck Public Schools Millage Proposal to Continue Providing Funds to Operate a System of Public Recreation and Playgrounds</p> <p>This proposal renews public recreation millage that expired with the 2022 tax levy and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963.</p> <p>Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Saugatuck Public Schools, Allegan County, Michigan, be increased by and the board of education be authorized to levy not to exceed 0.25 mill (\$0.25 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 5 years, 2023 to 2027, inclusive, to continue to provide funds for operating a system of public recreation and playgrounds (0.2378 mill of the above is a renewal of millage that expired with the 2022 tax levy and 0.0122 mill is to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963); the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect for the public recreation program if the millage is approved and levied in 2023 is approximately \$202,596?</p> <p>Yes <input type="radio"/></p> <p>No <input type="radio"/></p>
<p>Proposal 22-2 A proposal to amend the state constitution to add provisions regarding elections</p> <p>This proposed constitutional amendment would:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recognize fundamental right to vote without harassing conduct; Require military or overseas ballots be counted if postmarked by election day; Provide voter right to verify identity with photo ID or signed statement; Provide voter right to single application to vote absentee in all elections; Require state-funded absentee-ballot drop boxes, and postage for absentee applications and ballots; Provide that only election officials may conduct post-election audits; Require nine days of early in-person voting; Allow donations to fund elections, which must be disclosed; Require canvass boards certify election results based only on the official records of votes cast. <p>Should this proposal be adopted?</p> <p>Yes <input type="radio"/></p> <p>No <input type="radio"/></p>	<p>Township</p> <p>Road and Infrastructure Millage Reauthorization Proposal</p> <p>Shall the previously voted millage levied by Saugatuck Township, Allegan County, Michigan, reduced by the required millage rollback to .8998 mills, be renewed and increased back to the original levy of .9665 mills (\$.9665 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of five years (2023 through 2027, inclusive), for the purpose of paving, repairing, constructing, or reconstructing roads, sidewalks, bridges, drainage structures, or non-motorized trails or making pedestrian safety improvements, which levy is estimated to raise a total of \$377,615.00 in the first year, and shall the Township be authorized to levy said tax?</p> <p>Yes <input type="radio"/></p> <p>No <input type="radio"/></p>	<p>Shall the total limitation on the amount of taxes for operating purposes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Saugatuck Public Schools, Allegan County, Michigan, be increased by 22 mills (\$22.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), and against all principal residences, qualified agricultural property, qualified forest property, industrial personal property, commercial personal property, and all other taxable property as defined by law, by 1.50 mills (\$1.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), both millages to be for a period of 5 years, 2023 to 2027, inclusive; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect from the combined property taxes authorized herein if the millage is approved and levied in 2023 is approximately \$7,277,966?</p> <p>Yes <input type="radio"/></p> <p>No <input type="radio"/></p>	<p>Saugatuck Public Schools Sinking Fund Millage Proposal</p> <p>This proposal renews building and site sinking fund millage that expired with the 2022 tax levy and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963.</p> <p>Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Saugatuck Public Schools, Allegan County, Michigan, be increased by and the board of education be authorized to levy not to exceed 0.50 mill (\$0.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 3 years, 2023, 2024, and 2025, to continue to provide for the purchase of real estate for sites, for the construction or repair of school buildings, for school security improvements, for the acquisition or upgrading of technology, and for all other purposes authorized by law (0.4685 mill of the above is a renewal of millage for building and site sinking fund purposes that expired with the 2022 tax levy and 0.0315 mill is to restore millage for the same purpose lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963); the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2023 is approximately \$405,193?</p> <p>Yes <input type="radio"/></p> <p>No <input type="radio"/></p>
